Item 1.

The School Council will collect all donations, sort and if necessary wash them and then once a month open a shop on a Friday morning selling all clothing items for just a £1. The proceeds from the shop will then be used to fund future projects to improve the quality of school life for the pupils.

Mrs Edwards will be advertising the School Shop each week in the newsletter and advertising when the shop will be open.

In the meantime the reps in each class will ask the pupils to start the collection so that after Xmas when the weather is cold and people need extra items the shop will be able to open.
