Key Texts: A range of Traditional Tales

- Read and write known phonic graphemes
- Retell well-known stories
- Form upper and lowercase letters consistently
- Use a range of adjectives to form expanded noun phrases
- Use punctuation consistently, including capital letters for proper nouns
- Use conjunctions eg and, but so to extend sentences
- Write a range of texts, eg description, recipe, story.

Science

Materials

- Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard
- Identify and classify materials that can be recycled and solutions to single use plastics
- Find out how the shapes of solid objects can be changed by squishing, bending, twisting and stretching
- Use information gathered to suggest answers to scientific questions
- Record data to help answer questions

Maths

Place Value

- Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations including the number line
- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words.
- Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100, use < , > and = signs
- Given a number, identify one/ten more and one/ ten less (include writing as a number sentence)
- Use place value and number facts to solve problems

Wider Curriculum

Enquiry Question: Who is responsible for the world?

- In geography, children will explore the issue of human impact on the environment, especially exploring plastics in the oceans.
- In DT, children will design instruments made from sustainable and recyclable materials.
- In music, children will compose a song to raise the issue of protecting the environment.
- In PSHCE, children will learn about taking care of the planet.
