School Money

Please ensure that breakfast club and after school club is booked in advance. Please visit <https://eduspot.co.uk>, click the sign in button on the top, right hand side of the screen and select school money parent login. You will be asked to enter your main contact email address, mobile phone number, password and child's first name. If you cannot remember your login details, please contact the school office and you will be sent a reset password message.

What can you do on School Money?

You are able to pre-book school lunches, book breakfast club, after school club and make payments for lunches, trips, clubs and anything else that is required.

If you would like a paper copy of the parent guide, please pop into the school office to get one.

Remember – When booking clubs and lunches you need to go through the motion of paying once you have placed items in your basket, even if there is no payment to be made. If you do not follow this process through then the items are sat in your basket and your place/lunch options are not confirmed.

Reminder

Do not bring toys and equipment, including pencil cases into school

School will provide your child with all the equipment they will need for the school day.

Already this week, we have had personal items that children have brought in from home, lost and broken. Teachers are wasting learning time during the school day to sort out these problems which should not have occurred.



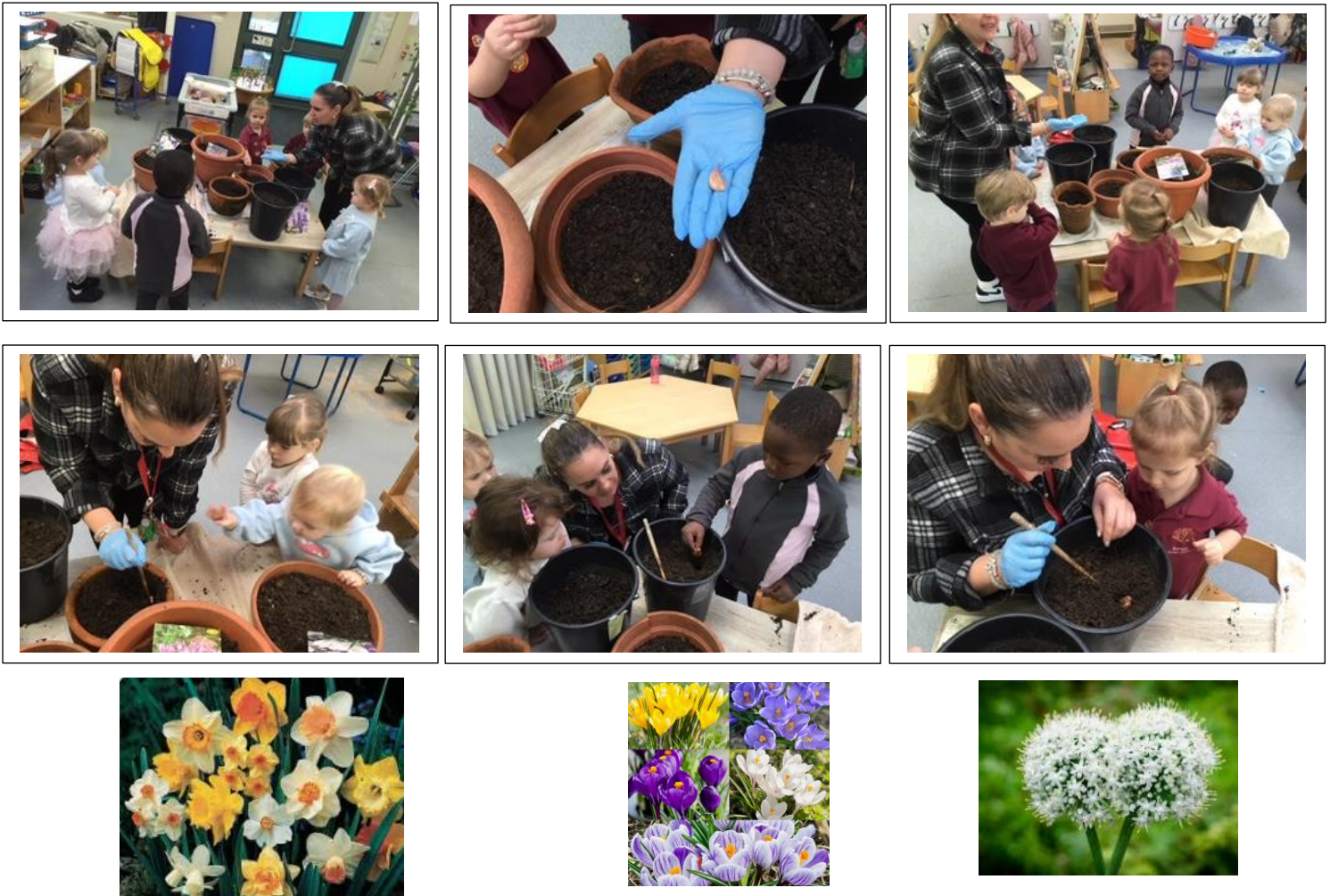
KS1 Trip

Changes to Truancy Penalty Notices (TPNs) for non-school attendance

The Department for Education (DfE) introduced a new National Framework for Truancy Penalty Notices, taking effect from 19 August 2024. A summary of the changes are detailed below.

Per parent, per child

TPNs will be issued to each parent, for each child that was absent from school without prior approval by the school.

For example – three siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving three separate TPNs

Five days of term time leave

TPNs will be issued for term time leave of five or more days which have not been authorised by the school.

10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period

TPNs will be considered when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.

First period of unauthorised absence exceeding 10 sessions (within a rolling three-year period).

The first time a TPN is issued for unauthorised absence from school the cost will be £160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 per parent if paid within 21 days.

Second period of unauthorised absence exceeding 10 sessions (within a rolling three-year period)

The second time a TPN is issued for unauthorised absence from school the amount will be £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third period of unauthorised absence exceeding 10 sessions (within a rolling three-year period)

For a third period of unauthorised absence a TPN will not be issued, and the case will be presented to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Supporting your child's school attendance

Good school attendance habits are best started early. Children learn from those around them and you as parents/carers set the standards and expectations for your child. Showing your child the importance of attending school every day not only helps your child to settle quickly when starting school but helps them to keep and maintain friendships and enjoy the school environment.

What to do if your child is unwell

You should notify the school on the first day your child is unable to attend due to illness before 9am. You will need to notify school for every day that your child is absent. You can either telephone the school on 522469 or email the school office on office@bartonpri.iow.sch.uk

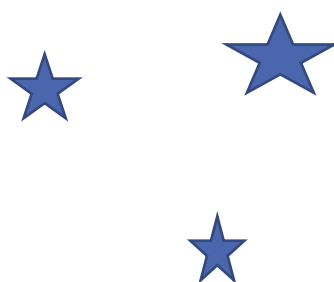

Important notice

Please **do not** park at the front of the school on drop off or pick up. There are plenty of parking spaces on Furlongs and in Garden Way.

Double yellow lines indicate a prohibition of waiting at any time and static cars are causing wider issues on the road at the front of the school.

Parents would like to give their children independence with walking to and from school, but it is becoming increasingly difficult for children to find a safe place to cross. **It is not safe for children to cross the road between parked cars.**

THE GREEN CROSS CODE

A thorough knowledge of the Green Cross Code is vitally important to primary school children aged **over 7 years**:

1. First find a safe place to cross
2. Stop just before you get to the kerb
3. Look all around for traffic and listen
4. If traffic is coming, let it pass, look all around again and listen
5. When it is safe go straight across the road - do not run
6. Keep looking and listening for traffic while you cross

STOP - LOOK - LISTEN
