Ellie H – For excellent contributions in lessons when sharing her thoughts using great vocabulary.

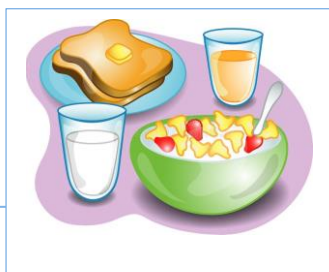
Archie A – For excellent attitude, application and behaviour at swimming.

School debt

If you have an outstanding balance due to the school, please log into your child's School Money account. You can pay the debt in full using a card payment. Alternatively, we can set up a weekly/monthly payment plan to pay the debt off in instalments. To do this, please contact the school office.

If the debt is due to school lunches, you will need to provide your child with a packed lunch until meal costs are settled. If the debt is due to after school club, your child will not be able to attend.

If you haven't either paid off the debt or contacted us to set up a payment plan, we will invite you to a meeting to explore options to help you pay the amount above. If you don't attend or if we don't reach a satisfactory result together, we may seek legal advice on recovering the debt.

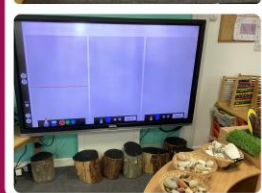

Allergy Aware School



Q - What happens if someone has an allergic reaction (anaphylaxis)?

A - The symptoms of a food allergy may include a rash anywhere on the body, or a tingling or itchy feeling in the mouth. Sickness and feeling lethargic. More serious symptoms may include: Swelling in the face, throat and/or mouth, difficulty breathing, severe asthma, abdominal pain, nausea and vomiting. In extreme cases there could be a dramatic fall in blood pressure (anaphylactic shock). The person may become weak and floppy and may have a sense of something terrible happening. This may lead to collapse and unconsciousness. On rare occasions, death can occur.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT WE ARE AN ALLERGY AWARE SCHOOL (INCLUDING EGG)

Packed lunches should not contain any products containing nuts (peanut butter, Nutella or similar nut based chocolate spreads, nut based cereal bars etc.)

ClassDojo – available now

ClassDojo is a secure school-to-home communication platform where parents can view photos and videos of their child's classwork, and see how many Dojo Points their child has earned for positive behaviour. Parents also receive notifications for new messages and posts and access a digital portfolio for their child.

Parents create accounts with a unique code from the teacher, and the platform is accessible via the mobile app or web browser.

How to Get Started

1. Parents/Carers should have already received a unique code from your child's teacher.
2. Create a parent account by downloading the free mobile app (iOS or Android) or visiting the ClassDojo website and creating a password.
3. Enter your unique code and select your child from the list to connect to their classroom.
