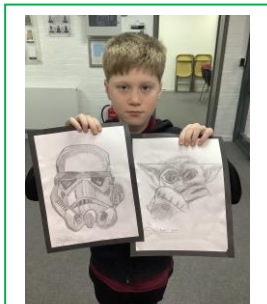

Reporting your child absent from school

The office is a busy place in the morning. If you wish to report your child's absence, please email the school office at: office@bartonpri.iow.sch.uk and give the reason for their absence. Please report the absence before 9am.

Alternatively, you can phone us but there is no option to leave an answer phone message.

Text messages and Facebook messages are checked infrequently so we advise you not to report an absence in that way.



Breakfast club gate

The breakfast gate will open at 8am and close at 8.05am to ensure staff are supporting the children attending the club. Please be at the gate promptly at 8am.

Parents should release their child at the gate and not at the door to ensure a smooth transition into school.

Breakfast is a great way to give the body the refuelling it needs. Children who eat breakfast tend to eat healthier overall and are more likely to be physically active and ready for the day. Missing breakfast can make children feel tired, restless, or irritable.

Attendance – late to school

At Barton Primary School we monitor pupil attendance and late marks closely and follow the Isle of Wight Council Education & Inclusion Service guidance. The Department for Education defines a pupil as a persistent absentee if they miss 10% or more of their possible school sessions for any reason, including lateness that results in a missed session. A child falling below this threshold will be closely monitored with Education and Inclusion involvement. **Children should be in their class by 8:30am in the morning.**

How does being late to school affect children?

A child who enters a classroom late often misses the principle objectives for the day and must start to catch up so will start the day from a place of disadvantage. Their late arrival is also likely to disrupt the class and delay learning for all.

Children who are often late have trouble settling in and mastering routines. Lateness can throw off their whole morning or even their day, especially if the late commute to school was stressful. They can often feel self-conscious about entering the classroom late.

Frequent lateness is associated with lower grades and lower scores on standardised tests. In addition, children who are routinely late at the primary school level are more likely to struggle in secondary school.

The MUGA gate will open at 8.20am and close at 8.30am. Any child arriving to school after 8.30am is classed as late and parents/carers will need to sign them in. Please leave the foyer promptly to reduce any upset for the children.

Allergy Aware School



Q - What happens if someone has an allergic reaction (anaphylaxis)?

A - The symptoms of a food allergy may include a rash anywhere on the body, or a tingling or itchy feeling in the mouth. Sickness and feeling lethargic. More serious symptoms may include: Swelling in the face, throat and/or mouth, difficulty breathing, severe asthma, abdominal pain, nausea and vomiting. In extreme cases there could be a dramatic fall in blood pressure (anaphylactic shock). The person may become weak and floppy and may have a sense of something terrible happening. This may lead to collapse and unconsciousness. On rare occasions, death can occur.

Packed lunches should not contain any products containing nuts (peanut butter, Nutella or similar nut based chocolate spreads, nut based cereal bars etc.)

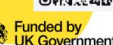
